### NAPLAN

In week 4 & 5, students from Year 3, 5, 7 & 9 will participate in the National Assessment Program- Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). *NAPLAN is a nationwide measure through which parents, teachers, schools, education authorities, governments and the broader community can determine whether or not young Australians are developing the literacy and numeracy skills that provide the critical foundation for other learning and for their productive and rewarding participation in the community. NAPLAN is a point-in-time assessment that allows parents to see how their child is progressing against national standards in literacy and numeracy and over time.* (ACARA, <https://www.nap.edu.au/naplan>, 2016). At Nannup DHS, students participating in NAPLAN this year have undertaken practice tests to ensure students are familiar with the NAPLAN online test platform and the styles of questions they may encounter. A timetable of when your child/ren will be completing the various assessments will be sent home in the coming week.
